



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About Jeevodaya

Jeevodaya is a non-profit organization started in the year 1999 with the passion of helping children who are living alone in and around railway stations, runaway and missing children by providing food, shelter and education. To make Itarsi a child friendly station in 1999 Sr. Clara, Sisters of St. Joseph of Chambery started Jeevodaya society. Over the past 20 years Jeevodaya has given support to more than twelve thousand children a secure and dignified life by reunification to their own family, rehabilitation, vocational training and job placement.

In the course of the journey, Jeevodaya learnt that, if these children are not reached out to in a timely manner, they could end up begging, child labour, getting involved in anti-social activities and trafficked for flesh trade. Moreover, they would lose the opportunity of enjoying childhood and would be denied of developmental opportunities. Thus, Jeevodaya decided to work in ITARSI and started a temporary shelter home for children in need of care and protection in collaboration with west central railway women's welfare organization. Also established long term shelters for girls and boys with the support of Donors and congregations. Jeevodaya ensures these children are provided education, vocational training, care and affection up to 18 years and support the youth above 18 years through vocational training and higher education.

In 2021 Jeevodaya celebrates its completion of 22 years of journey from the railway platforms of Itarsi railway station to providing quality residential facilities to rescued children through Child Care institutions and various other related programs for the holistic rehabilitation of the children.



Major Achievements & Activities – 2021-22

Children reached out through Outreach Service:

In the year 2021-22, 250 children (164 boys & 86 girls) from Itarsi Railway Junction of West Centre Railway Zone of Indian Railway. Among those 235 children were reunified with their families. Follow ups for the rehabilitated children are carried out by Jeevodaya CHILDLINE team members on regular intervals to ensure the wellbeing of these children.

Publication and release of Jeevodaya Annual report 2020-21:

It was on the occasion of Jeevodaya Annual Day Celebration, release of Jeevodaya annual report -2020-21 by Honorable Shri. Deepika Suri IPS (IG- Hoshangabad Division) 13th November 2021 in the presence of guests, well-wishers, Children and staff of Jeevodaya.

CHILDLINE se Dosti campaign :

Jeevodaya Railway CHILDLINE celebrated CHILDLINE Se Dosti Campaign on the day of universal Children Day on 14th November,2021 at Itarsi Railway station and in both children homes. The children from Jeevodaya children home together staff were part of the campaign.

The team provided awareness on child rights to Government Stakeholder such as Railway Station superintend, Deputy Station superintends, Inspector- RPF, Inspector- GRP, Army- military officials, Itarsi local police station and non govt. Stakeholders like coolie, vendors, shop keepers, youth and railway passengers from Itarsi railway station were part of the campaign. It was one of the major sensitisation programmes held with support of children, staff and stakeholders.

Monitoring visits by Govt. officials to Jeevodaya:

Government systems taking ownership in the protection of children as per the directions from Supreme court of India and government ministries in central and state government. As result, Government officials visit/monitoring are regular in Jeevodaya homes esp. ICPS officials, CWC, District judges, tribal welfare officer, District and state level Women & child department officials.

CHILD Help Group Meetings:

As per the Railway SOP, CHILD Help Group was formed in the Itarsi Railway Junction under the aegis of Station Superintend. Inspector RPF, SSO, GRP, CTI and Jeevodaya is a part of the group. In the period of April 2021 to March 2022 there are 03 CHG meetings were organised, in this meetings Jeevodaya has put many advocacy issues for the discussions.

Child rights and Child Protection Trainings in Schools:

Jeevodaya has Sensitized around 200 children on the Safety& Protection through Good touch and Bad touch Sessions in various schools in Itarsi. Also, we provide psychological and counselling support to children who are in need and identified through these sessions.

21st Annual day celebration of Jeevodaya. It was on 13thNovember, 2021 Jeevodaya celebrated its 22nd Annual day with Children, older children/youth, Government stakeholders, guests and well-wishers and staff. Due to pandemic Covid 19 the celebrations were on a restricted manner with following all standing directions of the government. The chief guest was Shri. Dipika Suri IPS (IG- Hoshangabad Division) and the guest of honour was Shri.Girish Sharma IAS. On the occasion the annual report of 2020-21 was also opened by the hands of Chief guest and Guest.

Health & Hygiene :

Regular quarterly health check-ups are conducted and children who are identified with need of further treatment are given treatments in hospitals and in other referral services. HB testing is done on a quarterly basis and, the children who are with low HB is given special diet food to improve their HB. Currently very few children are identified as low HB. General dental check-up is conducted for all children with the help of Govt Hospital Itarsi and further treatment is suggested for few children. De worming of all children done and Haemoglobin test has been conducted for all children and staff.

Education :

Schools were re-opened from pandemic situation and children started going school. We have taken special precautions for children to make sure zero infection at our homes. We had made special plans for education to cover up the gap and children who needed special attention and who are poor in studies are given special attention during this time. coaching classes Library time and moral education class is taken for the children in two groups (smaller and bigger children) on every Saturdays. Tuition classes were re started and teachers were engaged with children. During the library hours, children not only read the books but their reading practice is also taken care of. Short stories are shared by the children and the computer instructor during the library hours. They are enjoy reading new books and sharing stories with each other.

Collaboration with Asha Infinite Foundation

We have collaborated with Asha Infinite Foundation for English Speaking classes for the children. These classes were organised on a daily basis completely online. More than 25 children were benefitted from this class in their speaking and reading skills of English Language.

Child Participation :

Children are becoming more responsible for their duties and keen interested in manual work through children committees. They are also focusing on studies. Children played a vital role in annual day function's preparation. Children were very much excited and serious in practicing the dance, drama performances Children took initiative in gardening and divided themselves into three groups along with a staff, now children are taking more interest in gardening along with hose parents at home. Children committee meetings are conducted on regular basis and various responsibilities are divided among the committees.

Extra-Curricular activities :

Celebrations like Raksha Bandhan, Independence Day, Dahihandi, Diwali, Annual day celebrations and Celebrations of Birthdays were occasions, children from Jeevodaya home performed and proved extra ordinary talents. Not only in cultural programmes but drawing and art were also quite examples of young talents trained by Jeevodaya. Every Saturday, children are issuing books from the library under the supervision of computer instructor. Children are engaged in various activities like greeting card making, dance and drama practices etc.

Training and Capacity building programs :

Moral sessions and training are organized for children every Saturday by the computer Instructors and Social Workers of both homes. Through these sessions various moral topics will be covered and children are given opportunity to learn moral values for their life. These classes are taken in the digital class rooms of the homes. Also, occasional trainings on various topics were organised by CSA resource persons for the children and staff, in topics like, Art and Craft, General Knowledge etc.

Training sessions for home staff are given on various topics to enhance their capacity and skills, the session was mainly given on soft skills improvement, JJ Act and child related laws.

Advocacy Meetings and Initiatives :

Jeevodaya is actively participating in JJB review Monthly meeting at Hoshangabad under the aegis of Principal Magistrate, District Court in respect to implementation of Juvenile Justice Act,2015 and Child care institutions functioning.

Jeevodaya also place the advocacy issues in CHG meetings (Child Help Group) for supporting and smooth implementation of the Railway SOP at Itarsi Railway station. Through these meetings, the visibility of the Child Help Desk and involvement of various stakeholders are improved in a better way.

Summer Camp :

We have organised Summer Camp for the children on May and June months, in which children were engaged in a structured camp with assigned staff for the activities. The main objectives of the camp were to experience relaxation productivity and creativity, to develop positive relationship with elders, peer and family and to appreciate oneself others and make good use of resources. Children were divided as per the age group under staffs and they attended and organised various activities as per the plan and objectives.

An exhibition was also organised at the end of the camp, in which the materials and crafts made by the children. The Exhibition was inaugurated by the CMO and the SDM of Itarsi. staffs were given appreciation gifts they leads and trained the children.

Internship Programme :


Jeevodaya has signed an MOU with the UPES (University of Petroleum and Energy Studies) Dehradun for the internship program. Under the Srijan Social Internship program. In the reporting year, 02 law students were placed in Jeevodaya for 3 months of time. The interns were engaged in various projects and activities during their internship time, such as preparing resource materials for staff capacity building, teaching children for summer camp, collecting details about various social schemes, giving training to staff on various acts and laws etc.

Study & Research/ Assessment :

Jeevodaya has been a part of the study along with Atal Bihar Vajpayee center for Good Governance and Indian Institute of Social Science Delhi on issues of child care homes and after care along with recommendations for model child care homes in the state of Madhya Pradesh. The study was organized with an intension to understand the current status of quality of care in child care institutions and what improvement needs to be done for the better care. We have submitted the recommendations based on the experience and feedback of children to the study. It was a great opportunity for us to place our suggestions and recommendations before the state government.

Preventive & Rehabilitation activity with families living in railway Station (Action Plan by Collector)

As a part of Jeevodaya's community-based initiatives we were worked with the O3 families who were staying at Itarsi Railway Station for many years and were ended in begging and selling various substances in the station and trains. After seeing their vulnerable condition, we planned to rehabilitate them to the society with support of livelihood. We have submitted the details to the district collector and support for their children's education is provided. After many efforts we have provided rent homes (with half rent support) and provided "Hath Thela" a kind of small four wheeled vehicle to carry stuffs and materials also use to selling various materials. It helped the families to find a way to learn and live.

Care leavers Stories

Maina Raju (Perusing Diploma In Cyber Security)

Maina joined with Jeevodaya family in 2011. Maina was good in academics and extracurricular activities. She was very much interested in computer and related activities. After completing 12th Std, as per her interest, Maina opted for Diploma course in Cyber Security. CSA helped her to choose and find support for doing this course. Currently Maina is studying in Jabalpur and looking forward to building a career in cyber security.

Sapna Singh Thakur (Perusing course in Food processing and entrepreneurship)

Sapna came to Jeevodaya in 2020 as a child who needs care and protection. Sapna always had a determination and goal to study in hotel management filed and wanted to be independent. She completed her 10th Std from Jeevodaya and then as per the interest she joined course of Food processing and entrepreneurship with the help of CSA (Catalyst for Social Action) in Indore. Currently Sapna is working part time in a café and continuing her course in Indore.





Komal Singh (Perusing Diploma in Fashion Designing)

Komal came to Jeevodaya in 2022from Betul district of Madhya Pradesh. Komal wanted to study sewing and designing of dresses and it was her interest area.Jeevodaya helped her to complete 10th Std and with the help of CSA, she was able to join the course of Diploma in Fashion Designing in Bhopal. Komal is looking forward to get experience in the cloth designing and start her own firm once she has enough support and knowledge.

Vijeta Bahadur (Perusing Diploma in Dialysis Technology)

Vijeta came to Jeevodaya in 2011, she completed 12th STD with first class and opted to study Dialysis Technology with the guidance if CSA. Vijeta always wanted to build her career in medical filed and hence she selected a suitable course. Currently Vijeta is pursuing her course in Bhopal and looking forward to a bright future.





Case Studies

Case Studies-1: Amita, is 12 years old and admitted in Jeevodaya in 2020 by the CWC. She is abandoned by her parents with her 02 younger siblings in a distant relatives (Aunts) house. There, these 3 children faced cruel abuse by the Aunties son and husband sexually and physically. Amita hand was broken due to the physical torture she faced as she resisted the abuse.

When she came to Jeevodaya, she was very frightened and lost all confidence, she was given psychological support and counselling, and given medical treatments for regaining health. Correction surgeries are done 2 times for her broken hand for the proper movement.

After completing her legal process, we have took her admission in school and she is studying in 3rd standard today. She is very interested in studies and making progress. Her case is going on in the court, she fights for it and Jeevodaya supports her building up her life.

Case Studies-2: Malti is 8 years old and from a very poor family basically from Narmadapuram district, her mother has expired and father is a daily wager. When her father was arrested by police in a case, Malti and her brother was with her grandmother – who is very old and engaged in begging.

Malti`s grandmother was not able to look after her, and she was used to bed along with her grandmother and others. Later Malti was found near Itarsi railway station on railway lines in a dangerous situation and rescued by the RPF. She then, admitted to Chirag by the CWC on 2021. Now Malti is studying in class 2nd and very active. By considering the conditions, her brother also admitted in Jeevodaya boys home later.

Now Malti is free from begging and roaming around with her grandmother. She is given psychological and education support and looking forward to a bright future.

Case Studies-3 : According to the child's statement, the child said that he had come from Mandideep to Itarsi with an uncle to go to his maternal grandfather's house. He came to Itarsi with uncle and uncle left the child at the platform, sitting alone on the bench. The member was informed by a stakeholder through call, the child was rescued through by Child Help desk Staff, the information of the child was given in the Deputy SS Office and in the GRP thana and the family was contacted on the call. The child was handed over safely to the family in coordination with CWC.

Feedback from volunteers and Interns

I am PrathamMalviya currently pursuing B.Tech CSE from LPU, Punjab. I am very glad to complete my internship (Community Development Project) from Jeevodaya Society under support, guidance and training from training staff of CHILDLINE (1098). 
